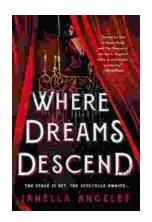
Gerda Weissmann Klein passed away in 2021 at the age of 97. She is survived by her children and grandchildren.

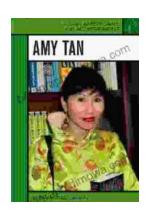
