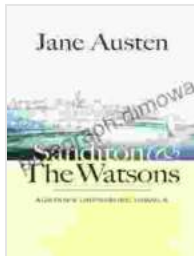

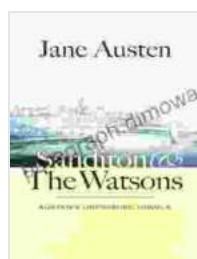
The cover of Jane Austen's unfinished novel, The Watsons.

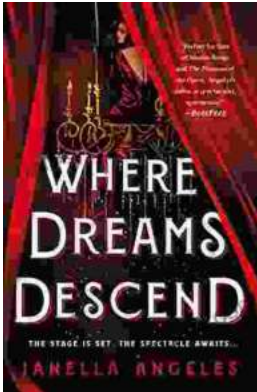
