


Bill Walsh



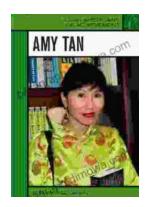
